DISCOVERY CRUISE * | 4d/3n (every Friday)

1st day | Friday | L D

High water season (Nov/May) or Low water season (Jun/Oct): Iquitos / Nauta / Marañón River

Upon arrival, receive a warm welcome at Iquitos International Airport by our crew. Board our private transfer to downtown Iquitos, for a panoramic city tour and a welcome lunch. Then transfer to Nauta port for embarkation. Settle into your generously sized suite as you begin one of life's greatest adventures. Following an introduction to our naturalist guides and a routine safety drill, gather at the restaurant for the first of many Amazonian cuisine experiences created by Aria Amazon's renowned consulting chef, Pedro Miguel Schiaffino.

2nd day | Saturday | B L D

High water season (Nov/May): Amazon River / Yacanapa Islands / Nauta Caño River

We start the day with early morning birdwatching along the majestic Amazon River. After breakfast, head out for a skiff excursion along the Yanayacu-Yacapana River, a tributary of the Amazon River, in search of wildlife including parrots, hawks, monkeys, and sloths. In the evening, embark on a wildlife excursion on the black waters of Nauta Caño River. End the night with extraordinary stargazing

Low water season (Jun/Oct): Clavero Lake / Ucayali River / Yarapa River

We start the day searching for incredible wildlife along the Ucayali River, including parrots, egrets, hawks, and monkeys. After breakfast, choose to go canoeing, kayaking, or swimming on the black water Clavero Lake, or visit an Amazonian village, where you can interact with native ribereños (people of the river). At dusk, explore the Yarapa River in search of exotic nocturnal wildlife.

3rd day | Sunday | B L D

High water season (Nov/May): Yanayacu-Pucate River / Marañón River / Casual

Begin the day's adventures near the main entrance of Pacaya Samiria National Reserve, cruising along Yanayacu-Pucate in the comfort of our private skiffs. Visit an Amazon village to interact with native ribereños (people of the river) and witness a demonstration of Aguaje palm harvesting. Kayak, canoe, and swim in the area's enchanting black waters, while staying on the lookout for the legendary pink dolphins. After lunch, take a jungle walking Casual's Forest and look for flora and fauna including medicinal trees, insects, and poison dart frogs.

Low water season (Jun/Oct): Amazon River / Tahuayo River / San Pedro Forest

As the day begins, embark on a morning wildlife excursion on the extraordinary Amazon River. After breakfast, explore the Tahuayo River, a black water tributary of the Amazon River, while our naturalist guides share stories of Amazonia. After lunch, we take a jungle walk at San Pedro or Puerto Prado's Forest to learn about the Amazonian flora and fauna



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4th day | Monday | **B**

High water season (Nov/May) or low water season (Jun/Oct): Nauta / Iquitos

In the morning, take a guided visit to the local market and marvel at the regional produce of the Peruvian Amazon. Return to Aria Amazon for breakfast before disembarkation. Enroute to the airport, visit the Manatee Rescue Center, where orphaned Amazonian manatees rehabilitate before they are released back into the wild.

EXPLORER CRUISE * | 5d/4n (every Monday)

1st day | Monday | **L D**

High water season (Nov/May) or Low water season (Jun/Oct): Iquitos / Nauta / Marañón River

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2nd day | Tuesday | **B L D**

High water season (Nov/May): Ucayali River / Yanallpa Creek / Dorado River

If you wish, get an early start and head out for a wildlife search along the Ucayali River. Later, head out on skiffs in search of pink river dolphins and witness the local farmers and fishermen go about their business. At dusk, ride along the black waters of Dorado River, searching for the mysterious wildlife that comes out after dark.

Low water season (Jun/Oct): Marañón River / Yanayacu-Pucate River

Get an early start to the day with a birdwatching excursion along the Marañón River. After breakfast, explore the black waters of Yanayacu-Pucate River with a possibility to see sloths, great egrets, parrots, and taricaya turtles. Visit an Amazon village to witness a demonstration of Aguaje palm harvesting. After lunch, go fishing for Amazonia's notoriously ferocious piranhas and for a dusk excursion in search of exotic nocturnal wildlife.

3rd day | Wednesday | **B L D**

High water season (Nov/May): Ucayali River / Puinahua River / Zapote River

Start the day with a hearty breakfast, before heading out to explore the Zapote River on skiffs. This will be a full-day river safari with a picnic lunch under the Amazonian shade. Walk in the floodplain forest and learn about the medicinal trees, insects, and frogs which inhabit the region. Later, cruise along the Ucayali River and enjoy the stunning sunset.

Low water season (Jun/Oct): Samiria River / Pacaya Samiria National Reserve

The rewards of our early start today are plentiful, including a picnic lunch under the Amazonian shade, orchestrated to the sound of the jungle symphony. Go fishing along the black waters of Samiria River and choose to go on a jungle walk, canoeing, kayaking, or swimming inside the Pacaya Samiria National Reserve. Later, cruise along the Ucayali River and enjoy the sunset.



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4th day | Thursday | **B L D**

High water season (Nov/May): Clavero Lake / Ucayali River / Yarapa River

We start the day searching for wildlife along the Ucayali River. After breakfast, choose to go canoeing, kayaking, or swimming on the black water Clavero Lake or visit an Amazonian village. In the afternoon, we explore the Yarapa River by skiff, in search of different kinds of wildlife. This evening before dinner, meet the crewmembers who have been working behind the scenes to ensure your exceptional experiences aboard the Aria Amazon.

FIT RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS

a) Reservations made 91 days or more before departure:

A deposit of US \$1000 per person is required to confirm the booking. The final balance is required 90 days prior to departure. If the payment is not received on time, the space(s) will be automatically released.

b) Reservations made 90 days or less prior to departure:

A full, non-refundable payment is required to confirm the booking.

FIT CANCELLATION POLICY*

a) Cancellations made 121 days or more before departure:

The deposit will be refunded, less a US \$500 service charge per person.

b) Cancellations made 120 to 91 days prior to departure:

All deposits are non-refundable.

c) Cancellations made 90 days or less prior to departure:

Full payment will be applied as the cancellation penalty.
