2nd day | Lodge / Surroundings / Lodge **B L D**

Breakfast. In the morning, visit the **Sandoval Lake**, natural habitat of river lions, piranhas, birds, fish and monkeys, and the **Monkey Island** (optional) to observe different monkey species. Return to the lodge to have lunch. In the afternoon, visit a **lookout tower** with a height of 20 and 42 meters and designed for birdwatching and viewing of other types of animals living at this altitude. In addition, you will enjoy an incredible view of the sunset. Return to the lodge to have dinner.

3rd day | Lodge / Puerto Maldonado **B**

At sunrise, we will walk to a **parrot clay lick** situated at a stream protected by the **Tambopata Candamo National Reserve** in order to enjoy the multicolored spectacle of dozens of parrots feeding. After breakfast, the boat will take us back to the city. There we will visit the local market to show you agricultural products of the region, especially fruits of the Amazon. Transfer to the airport.

CORTO MALTÉS 4D/3N

1st day | Puerto Maldonado / Lodge **L D**

Reception at the airport. Transfer to the lodge along the Madre de Dios River. After lunch, **2–3-hour jungle trek** where the guide will show you tropical trees, medicinal plants and the abundance of nature guards. Dinner and overnight.

2nd day | Lodge / Surroundings / Lodge **B L D**

Breakfast. In the morning, visit the **Sandoval Lake**, natural habitat of river lions, piranhas, birds, fish and monkeys, and the **Monkey Island** (optional) to observe different monkey species. Return to the lodge to have lunch.

In the afternoon, visit a **lookout tower** with a height of 20 and 42 meters and designed for birdwatching and viewing of other types of animals living at this altitude. In addition, you will enjoy an incredible view of the sunset. Return to the lodge to have dinner.



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3rd day | Lodge / Surroundings / Lodge **B L D**

After breakfast, 20-minute boat trip down the river, we arrive at the **chacra**, that is a local farm owned by a typical family of the agricultural region, where domestic plants are carefully cultivated, without the use of chemicals, and which are later offered at the main market in Puerto Maldonado. We will distinguish and even taste different tropical fruits of the season and other domestic products (cacao, banana, cocona, breadfruit, noni, manioc, lime, among others). Then, we will visit a **native family**, who will show us some of their customs and demonstrate their main activities (fishing, hunting and handicraft), passed on by their ancestors from various indigenous tribes of the rainforest. After having lunch, return to the lodge. Rest of the afternoon is at leisure. Overnight.

4th day | Lodge / Puerto Maldonado **B**

At sunrise, we will walk to a **parrot clay lick** situated at a stream protected by the **Tambopata Candamo National Reserve** in order to enjoy the multicolored spectacle of dozens of parrots feeding. After breakfast, the boat will take us back to the city. There we will visit the local market to show you agricultural products of the region, especially fruits of the Amazon. Transfer to the airport.

In the afternoon, take a walk-through **Concepción Trails**, inside property nature trails, where you will discover and learn about primary and secondary rainforest, its components, uses, transformations by the human being, and its relevance for the world. At dusk, navigate by outboard motorized canoe, at the **Twilight River excursion**. By sailing on the Madre de Dios River, you will learn about its ecosystem, Amazonian creeks, nocturnal animals' behaviour, and the southern constellations. In the evening, enjoy a dinner in the Casa Grande's dining room.

After breakfast, long trek through terra firma into the Tambopata National Reserve towards **Sandoval Lake**. Here, you will understand why Madre de Dios is called the biodiversity capital of Peru, while learning about the Reserve's conservation efforts and the lake's formation. Navigate by dugout canoe across the mirror-like oxbow lake that is home to the endangered giant river otter (*Pteronura brasiliensis*), blue and yellow macaw (*Ara ararauna*), red howler monkey (*Alouatta seniculus*), black caiman (*Melanosuchus niger*), and one of the world's biggest fresh waters scaled fish, the paiche (*Arapaima gigas*). Return to the lodge to have lunch. In the afternoon, **Inkaterra Canopy Walkway and Anaconda Walk**: take a 20-minute ride by outboard-motorized canoe to the Inkaterra Canopy Walkway Interpretation Center where you will learn about its construction and the conservation projects of ITA-Inkaterra Asociación (NGO). Ascend one of the two 98-foot towers (30 m.) and cross the 7 hanging bridges that connect the treetops at 91 ft. high (28 m). Enjoy the breathtaking vistas and get the chance to watch white-throated toucans (*Ramphastos tucanus*), woodpeckers, trogons, squirrel monkeys (*Saimiri boliviensis*) and the three-toed sloth (*Choleopus hoffmani*). After descending keep on feeling the incredible primary rainforest energy going along the 200-meter wooden bridge over the swamps (aguajales). You will learn about the fauna and flora of this flooded ecosystem.

At night, get ready for an adventure during the **hidden rainforest excursion**, where you will explore the Amazon rainforest that gives way to nocturnal animals who display intriguing behavior patterns, and enhanced senses as adaptation mechanisms. Listen to nocturnal living nature sounds, and penetrate this hidden world. End up your day with a pleasant dinner.

After breakfast, take a ride back to Puerto Maldonado by outboard-motorized canoe. At the arrival, transfer to the airport.

Try native fishing applying the "catch and release" techniques, as you enjoy the scenery observing hoatzins (*Opisthocomus hoazin*), a diversity of flycatchers, and gray-necked woodrails (*Aramides cajanea*). Disembark at the remains of Fitzcarrald steamboat; learn about its history and how it inspired Inkaterra to ask Werner Herzog to film the award-winning "Fitzcarrald", best director at Cannes, 1982. You will be able to participate in the **inland collpa** during the evening, where you will see different species and their night routines by observing through our "blinds". End up your day with a pleasant dinner.

4th day | Lodge / Puerto Maldonado **B**

After breakfast, take a ride back to Puerto Maldonado by outboard-motorized canoe. At the arrival, transfer to the airport.

Learn how the Brazil nut is collected using traditional tools and techniques, and try to open one of them using a machete and a nutcracker, to finally, enjoy a fresh Brazil nut. Return to the lodge to have lunch. In the afternoon, visit the **cacao plantation** and take part of the chocolate making process. Learn how to select the fresh cacao fruits, discover how the seeds are fermented and sundried. After peeling the toasted cacao seeds and grinding them into an aromatic paste, end the excursion with a selection of treats made from our organic chocolate. You will be able to participate in the **inland collpa** during the evening, where you will see different species and their night routines by observing through our "blinds". End up your day with a pleasant dinner.



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5th day | Lodge / Puerto Maldonado B

After breakfast, take a ride back to Puerto Maldonado by outboard-motorized canoe. At the arrival, transfer to the airport.

MANU NATIONAL PARK – CLOUD FOREST (from Cusco) 3D/2N

1st day | Cusco / Cock-of-the-Rock Lodge **BL D**

Our overland journey begins at 3,400m/11,150 ft, with an early departure from the highland city of Cusco. Today's destination is the lush cloud forest region where the Andes fall away to the Amazon basin. This is a day of scenic drama and striking contrasts. We first visit a mountain wetland habitat teeming with migrant and local waterfowl, before crossing two mountain ranges between the Cusco valley and the Paucartambo valley, to a maximum altitude of 3,900m/12,790ft. Finally, we follow a sinuous ribbon of highway on its plunge through an extraordinary world of forested cliffs, waterfalls and gorges. We take leisurely stops to see mountain villages, a hilltop necropolis of chullpas (pre-Inca burial chambers), and the abrupt ridge top of Ajanaco, which marks the final high point where the Andes begin their swoop into the Amazon basin. In clear weather, we will see a breathtaking panorama of cloud forest and mountain giving way to the lowland rainforest plains far below us. After a lunch we descend through the startling and rapid environmental transformations characteristic of the tropical Andes, passing from grassland and stunted trees through elfin forest, until we wind through a lush and magical world of overhanging trees, giant ferns, monster begonias, countless orchids and bromeliads, and a diverse and teeming birdlife.

We make frequent spontaneous stops, perhaps spotting a brilliantly feathered quetzal, a trogon, or the wild turkey-like Guan. We reach the comfortable Cock-of-the-Rock Lodge.

2nd day | Cock-of-the-Rock Lodge **B L D**

In the early morning, we have a chance to view the Cock-of-the-Rock in full, raucous courting display. This lek and its observation blind are famous among birders, since nowhere else on the planet allows so many of these spectacular blazing red birds to be seen so easily. (Note that the very best months for viewing Cocks-of-the-Rock are in September, October and November, although the males display throughout the year.) Afterwards we can stroll along the clearing formed by the nearby road, spotting other birds, and with luck some Brown Capuchin or Woolly Monkeys.

After a hearty breakfast, we can explore the forest overhanging the gravel road near the lodge, or some of the miles of trails that wind through the valley, to see high elevation cloud forest birds. This is a relaxed and enchanting day. As we amble among the woods and waterfalls we can marvel at the extraordinary variety of orchids, bromeliads, ferns, begonias, lichens and mosses -- and we also have a chance of sighting Woolly and/or Brown capuchin monkeys. Along the way, we may encounter some of the most colorful denizens of the cloud forest, such as the brilliant Golden-headed Quetzal, Gray-breasted Mountain Toucan, Blue-crowned Motmot, Umbrella Bird, Blue-banded Toucanet, fruit-eating tanagers, Red-crested Cotinga, Banded-tail Fruit-eater, and a variety of flycatchers.

In the afternoon, we can relax at the lodge, enjoying the dining hall viewing platform, or our private forest-overlook balcony or we can cross the river on the lodge's private oroya (cable bridge) and hike the trail on the south side of the Kosñipata River.

3rd day | Cock-of-the-Rock Lodge to Cusco **B BL**

After an early breakfast, we set off once more up the cloud forest highway, pausing here and there to alight and stroll in search of more birds: ones we have already seen, but are too spectacular to ignore, and birds we are seeing for the first time or perhaps we will glimpse monkeys that have so far eluded us. We wind our way through the enchanted mountain landscape on our route back to Cusco, knowing that the memory of this will remain with us for years to come.

MANU NATIONAL PARK – MANU WILDLIFE CENTER (from P. Maldonado) 4D/3N

1st day | Puerto Maldonado-Colorado-Manu Wildlife Center **L D**

Early morning, transfer service by van to Santa Rosa Village, we will get there in about two-hours and a half journey, you will cross the Inambari river for a 15 minutes boat trip to Puerto Carlos. Here, you will start your overland journey to Boca Colorado for 45 minutes by car, followed by four hours and a half-motorized boat journey ride upstream the Madre de Dios River. We arrive to Manu Wildlife Center for lunch. Later, we make our first acquaintance with the rainforest, exploring some of the 30 miles of forest trails that surround the lodge. We have an excellent chance of encountering some of the 12 species of monkeys, including the Spider Monkey and Emperor Tamarin, which inhabit the surrounding forest. After dinner, there will be an enchanting night walk along the trails, in search of the nocturnal birds and animals of the rainforest.

2nd day | Manu Wildlife Center **B L D**

The hide provided with individual chairs and a convenient place for cameras and binoculars to a distance of 15 meters. After this, we continue walking and exploring on the network of trails surrounding the lodge then we return to the lodge for lunch. Later, we continue to explore and discover the rainforest, its lore and plant life, on the network of trails surrounding the lodge, arriving in the late afternoon at our 34m/112ft. Canopy Tower. On its platform, we witness the frantic rush-hour activity of twilight in the rainforest canopy, before night closes in. Then we set off along the "collpa trail", which will take us to the lodge's famous Tapir Clay lick. Here at the most active tapir lick known in the entire Amazon, our research has identified from 8-12 individual 600-pound Tapirs who come to this lick to eat clay from under the tree roots around the edge. This unlikely snack absorbs and neutralizes toxins in the vegetarian diet of the Tapir, the largest land animal of Latin America. The lick features a roomy, elevated observation platform 5m/17ft above the forest floor. The platform is equipped with freshly made-up mattresses with pillows. Each mattress is covered by a roomy mosquito net. The 10-m-long, elevated walkway to the platform is covered with sound-absorbing padding to prevent our footsteps from making noise. This Tapir Experience is unique and exciting because these normally very shy creatures are visible up close, and flash photography is not just permitted, but encouraged. The hard part for modern city dwellers is to remain still and silent anywhere from 30 minutes to two or more hours. Many prefer to nap until the first Tapir arrives, at which point your guide gently awakens you to watch the Tapir 10-20m/33-66ft) away below the platform. Most people feel that the wait is well worth it in order to have such a high probability of observing the rare and elusive Tapir in its rainforest home.

3rd day | Manu Wildlife Center **B L D**

4th day | Manu Wildlife Center-Puerto Maldonado **B**

We leave our lodge very early on the two-hour and a half, return boat trip downstream to the Colorado Village. Depending upon the time, we must be in Puerto Maldonado, the breakfast will be served at the lodge or on the boat while you enjoying early morning wildlife activity as we go, of course this is a perfect time to take advantage of valuable early morning wildlife activity along the river, in additions this journey allows us to see several lowland native settlements and gold miners digging and panning gold along the banks of the Madre de Dios River. We will stop in the far-west type gold-mining town of Colorado to start our overland journey to Puerto Carlos for 45 minutes, then you will cross the Inambari River for 15 minutes boat trip to Santa Rosa, finally a van or bus will drive us in approximately two-hours to the airport in Puerto Maldonado City, with this assistance your jungle adventure ends.

After breakfast, we will explore on the network of trails, having more emphasis in visiting trees that are with flowers and fruits, this thanks to the information of our resident and naturalist guides. Here we expect to find more species of monkeys, as well as also numerous species of birds. Before or after the dinner, the passengers who have energy and want more experience, they will have the second opportunity to visit the Observation Tower as well as the mammals or tapir clay lick (Collpa de mamiferos).

5th day | Manu Wildlife Center-Puerto Maldonado **B**

We leave our lodge very early on the two-hour and a half return boat trip downstream to the Colorado Village. Depending upon the time, we must be in Puerto Maldonado, the breakfast will be served at the lodge or on the boat while you enjoying early morning wildlife activity as we go, of course this is a perfect time to take advantage of valuable early morning wildlife activity along the river, in additions this journey allows us to see several lowland native settlements and gold miners digging and panning gold along the banks of the Madre de Dios River. We will stop in the far-west type gold-mining town of Colorado to start our overland journey to Puerto Carlos for 45 minutes, then you will cross the Inambari River for 15 minutes boat trip to Santa Rosa, finally a van or bus will drive us in approximately two-hours to the airport in Puerto Maldonado City.
